

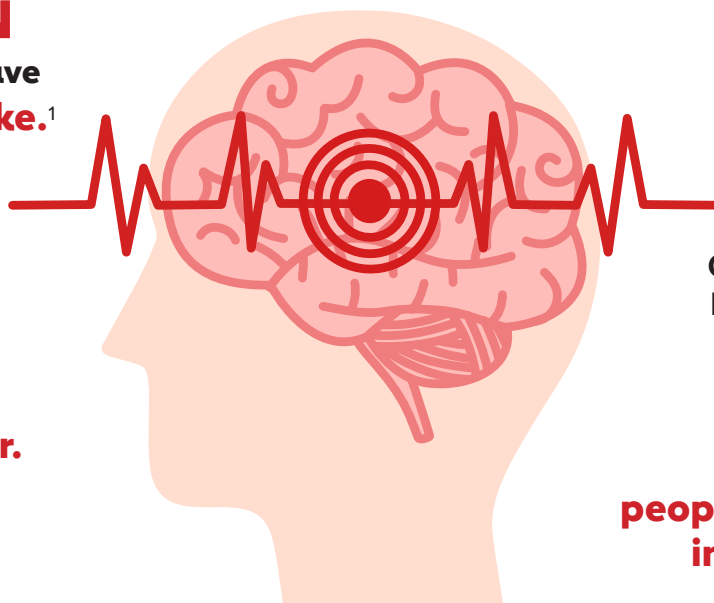
Growing Need for Quality Stroke Care

One every 3 seconds.²

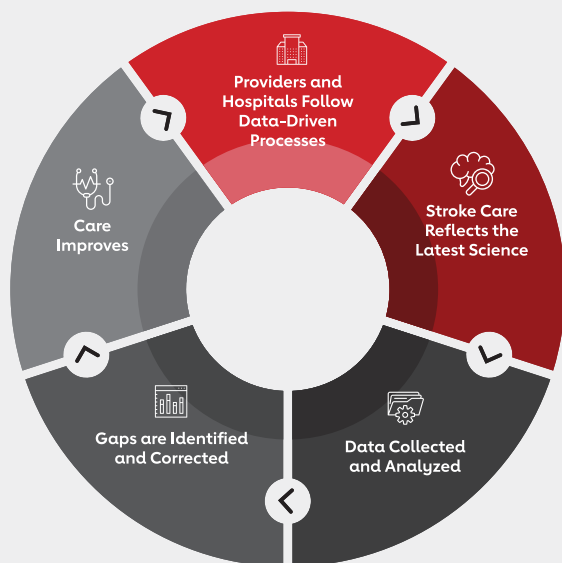

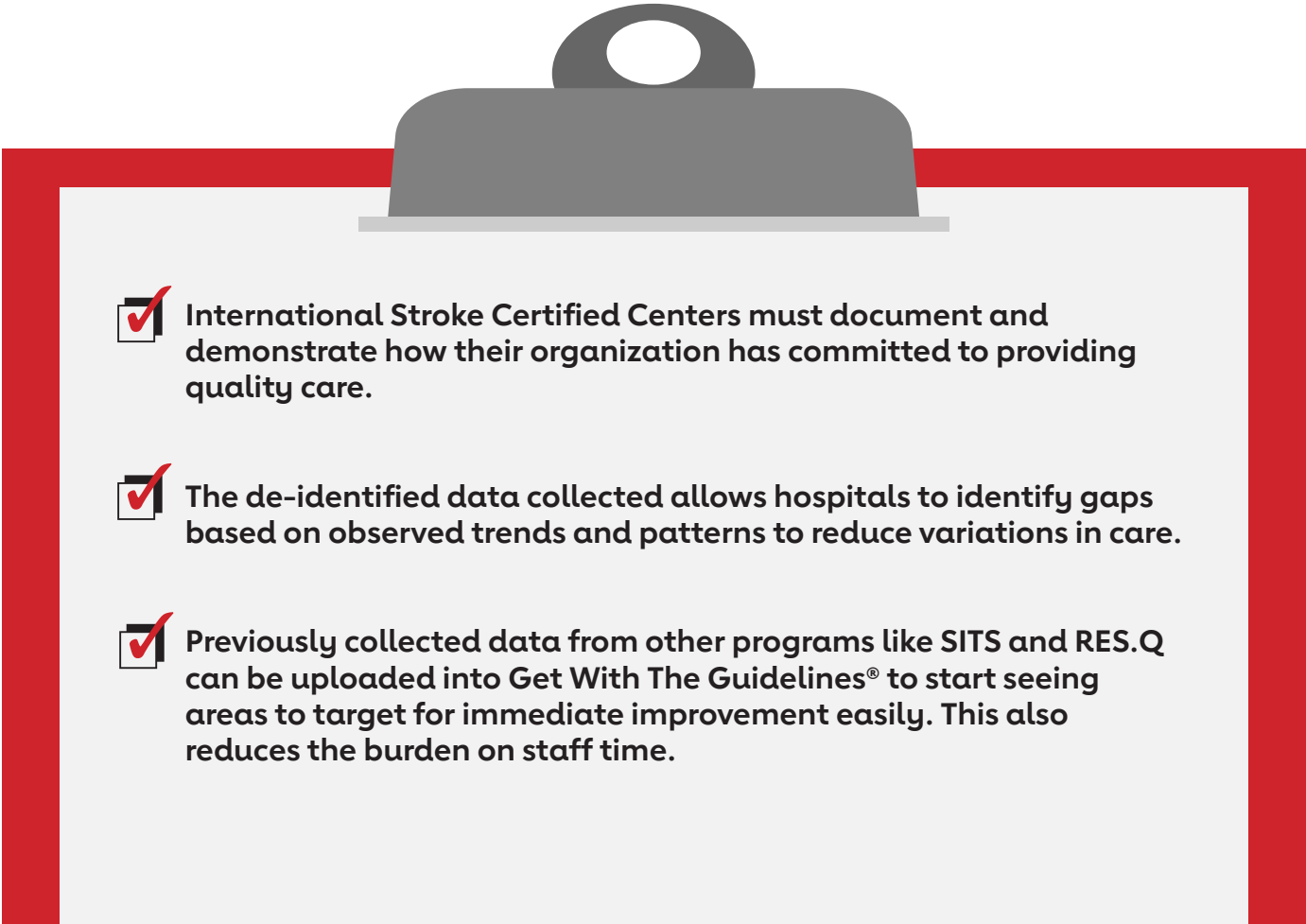

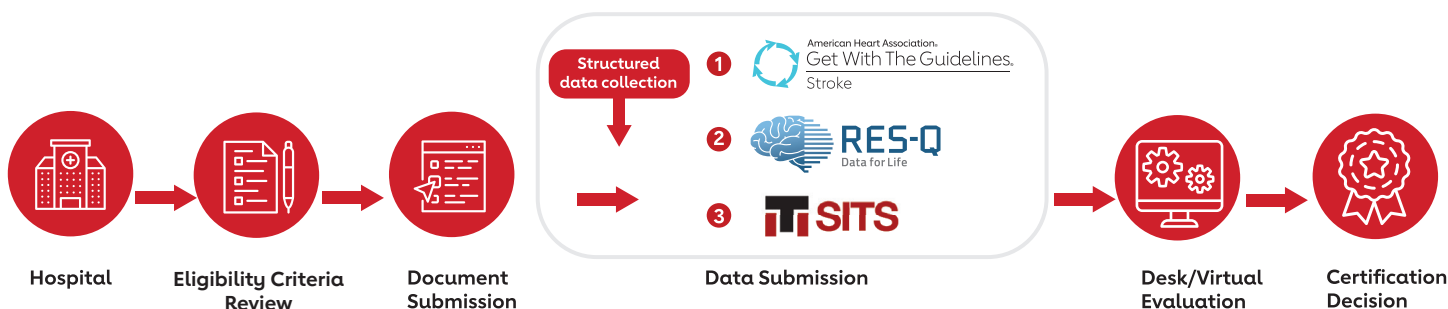
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- ☒ International Stroke Certified Centers must document and demonstrate how their organization has committed to providing quality care.
