


Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support

The American Heart Association's Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Provider Course has been updated to reflect new science in the *2025 American Heart Association Guidelines for CPR and Emergency Cardiovascular Care (ECC)*, the *2025 Guideline for the Management of Patients With Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS)*, and the *2026 Guideline for the Early Management of Patients with Acute Ischemic Stroke: A Guideline From the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association*. The ACLS Course teaches the importance of preventing cardiac arrest, high-performance teams, continuous high-quality CPR, systems of care, recognition and intervention of cardiopulmonary arrest, post-cardiac arrest care, acute dysrhythmias, stroke, and ACS.

WHO SHOULD TAKE THE COURSE?

Healthcare professionals who direct or manage cardiac arrest, stroke, or other cardiopulmonary emergencies; personnel in emergency response, emergency medicine, intensive care, and critical care units such as physicians, nurses, and paramedics.

COURSE DELIVERY

Three different course formats are available to accommodate the learning needs of individual students and offer flexibility for Instructors. All three course formats include the same learning objectives and result in the same course completion card.



Instructor-led training (ILT)

This option is led by an American Heart Association Instructor in a classroom. The ACLS ILT course option includes Video Prework (8 interactive video lessons with knowledge checks) that students must complete before attending class. Full and Update Course agendas remain available.



Blended learning (HeartCode® ACLS)

Blended learning uses online technology not only to supplement but also to transform and improve the learning process. After successfully passing HeartCode® Online, students will receive a Certificate of Completion. Students must then attend an in-person skills testing session where they will receive a Provider eCard upon successful completion, valid for 2 years.



Resuscitation Quality Improvement® (RQI®)

A unique ECC program designed specifically for training actively employed healthcare providers in clinical environments. Unlike the Instructor-led and/or blended course, the RQI program is a maintenance-of-competence platform designed for site-specific adoptions.
